

Philip Pearlstein was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in 1924. He received the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Carnegie Institute of Technology (now Carnegie Mellon University) in 1949 and the Master of Fine Arts degree from New York University in 1955. Mr. Pearlstein received a Fulbright Fellowship in 1958, a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship in 1968 and the American Academy of Arts and Letters Award in 1973. He taught at Pratt Institute, New York City from 1959 to 1963 and was Visiting Critic at Yale University in 1962-63. From 1963-1988 he was Professor of Fine Art at Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York, becoming Distinguished Professor Emeritus in 1988.
